We are called by God to respond to the world around us ... even for a moment

can't help but to think of God's glory as the sun is peaking between the rain clouds casting rays of light across the beautiful landscape here in Missouri. This week I was weeding out one of the flower beds in the front yard after a heavy rain. As I worked around the big oak tree in the front yard, I saw a little squirrel that had fallen from its nest. I thought the little creature had no life but then it waved its paw at me.

Before we go on ... unfortunately, the squirrel lost its life. I suspect the exposure to the elements was too much. This reflection is not a rescue

story it is about coming alongside all of creation to be the presence of God.

When I found the little squirrel cold and wet, I stopped working and scooped up this little creature. I brought it

inside, gently dried it off and I placed it in front of a heater. In the last few hours of its life, I believe that it felt safe and secure. When the squirrel took its last breath I feel secure that the Lord rescued and honored even the littlest of creatures as it moved from this side of life to the next.

This may sound like a sad story, but I believe that it can serve as a stark reminder that we must consider the care that we give to others. Each person will experience seasons of plenty and seasons of strife. As we experience these seasons, we may be placed in others' lives to give them care and compassion for a moment of time. Just like the littlest of creatures can

Whitsunday/Pentecost: Come Holy Spirit!

hitsun (also Whitsunday or Whit Sunday) is the name used in Britain, and other countries among Anglicans and Methodists, for the Christian holy day of Pentecost. It falls on the seventh Sunday after Easter and commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon Christ's disciples (as described in Acts 2).

I remember my Dad, an Episcopal priest, always called Pentecost – Whitsunday. He often preached on its meaning as Whitsunday, versus Pentecost.

According to Dr. Hal Knight, Emeritus professor at the St. Paul School of Theology, Charles Wesley published his Whitsunday hymns in 1746.

Whitsunday is also known as "White Sunday." This may refer to white vestments worn on that day, though today, red is the color displayed. While most Methodist ministers don't wear vestments, you'll see that our paraments are red.

Knight also mentions that "white" and "wit" are "often linked in early English and may refer to the Holy Spirit giving us wisdom."

In Hymn IV, Charles Wesley wrote:

Sinners, lift up your hearts,
THE PROMISE to receive!
Jesus himself imparts,
He comes in man to live,
The Holy Ghost to man is given;
Rejoice in God sent down from heaven.
Jesus is glorified,
And he gives the Comforter,
His Spirit to reside.
In all his members here:
The Holy Ghost to man is given;
Rejoice in God sent down from heaven.
We celebrate Pentecost (or Whitsunday) on
Sunday, May 19th this year.

"The story in Acts 2 describes a powerful wind and tongues of fire as the Holy Spirit was poured out on people from all over the world who came to Jerusalem to celebrate a Jewish feast. At the first Pentecost over

Shoes for Orphan Souls: We recently partnered with the local Rotary Club and collected 42 pairs of new shoes for the Shoes for Orphan Souls ministry. Lexing-

ton's collection totaled 368 pairs of new shoes for this ministry. These shoes are distributed in more than 80 countries to needy children.

Acolytes/Light Bearers/Servers: We are in need of people to serve in this capacity. At this time, we need light bearers ... who will carry the Light of Christ into the sanctuary and light the two altar candles at the beginning of the service, and, relight the torch from an altar candle at the end of the service and then extinguish the two altar candles. The acolyte will then carry the lit torch (Light of Christ) out of the sanctuary.

Other areas in which you can serve are as follows:

Communion Steward: Prepare and Set up for Communion Sunday. Assist Pastor Andrew in serving communion to the communicants.

Ushers: Collect the offering. Assist anyone in finding a place to sit. Meet & Greet visitors.

Greeters: Greet folks as they enter the church for worship, providing them with a bulletin. Encourage visitors to sign the guest book. Introduce yourself and the visitors to someone who can make them feel welcome.

Baby Grace volunteers are needed to help Baby Grace move to the Scout Room, sort clothing and help organize everything. Distribution is first and third Saturdays, 10 to Noon. Lauren Negrete is the volunteer in charge of this ministry.

Noisy Offering has been reinstated. It will be the first Sunday of the month and benefit the Baby Grace ministry.

 A goal is to increase attendance by 30% in three years and 100% in five years. We have already doubled the attendance we had from a year ago.

FINANCE

We will pay 10% of any excess funds we have at the end of the month toward our yearly apportionments. Phillip also explained what many of the apportionments are used for which includes funding grants we might be able to receive as well as a new pastor's moving expenses and even a pastor's seminary education.

Liz Fenner added that we need to tell our story to the community – currently, Liz Johnson is sending articles and photos to the Lexington News about what we're doing here at the church. Telling our story keeps it in the minds of the community what LUMC is all about.
