the one Jesus loved, and said, 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we don't know where they have put him!'

So Peter and the other disciple started for the tomb. Both were running, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. Finally the other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went inside. He saw and believed. Then the disciples went back to where they were staying."

The disciples ran, searched and eventually found with joyous hearts the Lord, our Savior!! When I remember my daughters searching for Easter eggs, I watched them and other children in fields or buildings running, laughing, and searching for that prize they would find in their eggs.
